


BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM 1. Stitch (Abbroviated 'st')

Slip knot

Every piece of crochet chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers (leaving a tail) and pull the tail halfway through the loop. Insert the crochet hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop taut onto the crochet hook.









2. Chain Stitch (Abbroviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.








3. Slip Stitch (Abbroviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smallest of all crochet stitches. You can use this stitch by slip-stitching the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.








4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crochet hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.









5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. Make 2 sc in the same knot.









6. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'Dc')

The double crochet is one of the most common crochet stitches and is about twice as tall as a single crochet. Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook. Then insert the crochet hook into the next stitch loop. Wrap the yarn with your crochet hook and pull the loop through the stitch (three loops now on the hook). Wrap the yarn around the hook again and pull it through the first two loops, leaving two loop on the hook. Then, wrap the yarn around the hook again and bring it through the remaining two loops to leave only one loop on the hook. Complete the row.


















7. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the chain stitches into a circle. Each round starts with ch and ends with sl st.

8. Fasten off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Fasten off by pulling the yarn through the end stitch and pulling it taut. Cut off.









9. Weaving in/invisible close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Draw the end through the final loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle. Weave your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.









Please noted that all yarns needs to be hidden behind the stitch.

ch chain

slip stitch

sc single crochet
dc double crochet

inc-dc double crochet increase (_) repeat the step between

the brackets repeat steps x times

F/O fasten off

MAKE 4 CROCHET COASTERS

R1: (Choose 1 yarn colour to make 1 coaster) dc x 12 times [12 sts]

R2: inc-dc x 12 times [24 sts]


R3: (dc, inc-dc) x 12 times [36 sts]

R4: (2 dc, inc-dc) x 12 times [48 sts]

R5: (2 dc, inc-dc) x 15 times [60 sts]

R6: (sc, 1 knot apart, 5 dc, 1 knot apart) x 15 times, fasten off

Now you have finished 1 coaster. Repeat the steps above to make a coaster in another colour.


