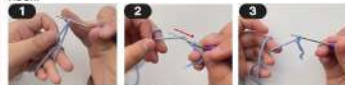


BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

1. Stitch (Abbreviated 'st')

Slip knot

Every piece of crochet chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers (leaving a tail) and pull the tail halfway through the loop. Insert the crochet hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop taut onto the crochet hook.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.



3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smallest of all crochet stitches. You can use this stitch by slip-stitching the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



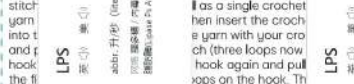
4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crochet hook and draw up the loop pull it



5. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'dc')

The double crochet is the most common of all stitches. When inserting the crochet hook into the chain, you insert the hook three loops now hook again and pull up the loop.



Draw the yarn around the hook again and bring it through the remaining two loops to leave only one loop on the hook. Complete the row.

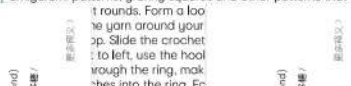


6. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the chain stitches into a circle. Each round starts with ch and ends with sl st.

7. Magic Ring

A magic ring is an adjustable starting round used for crochet amigurumi patterns, granny squares and other patterns that



8. Sewing

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic needle strap yarns are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



If details need to be added to the product (such as mouth, eyes, etc.) and thread to be used, create small stitches.



9. Fasten Off

Fasten off by pulling the thread through the last loop and pulling it taut. Cut the thread.



10. Weaving In/Invisible Close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Draw the end through the final loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle. Weave your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.



Please noted that all yarns needs to be hidden behind the stitch.

STITCHES USED

- ch chain
- sl slip stitch
- sc single crochet
- inc increase crochet
- dec decrease crochet
- dc double crochet
- hdc half double crochet
- tr triple crochet
- () repeat the step between the brackets
- x repeat steps x times
- F/o fasten off

MAKE A CROCHET GRANNY SQUARE SCARF

1. Square pieces x 12

- R1: (Please use the green yarns) (3 dc, 2 ch) x 4 times [12 sts]
- R2: (Please use the purple yarns) (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch) x 4 times [24 sts] (Note: Each stitch is completed on each of 4 corners of R1)
- R3: (Please use the pink yarns) [3 dc, 2 ch, (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch)] x 4 times [36 sts]
- R4: (Please use the mustard yarns) [3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch)] x 4 times [48 sts] (Note: Each 3 dc is completed at each interval of R3, and (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc) is at each of 4 corners of R3)
- R5: (Please use the green yarns) [3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch)] x 4 times [60 sts] (Note: Each 3 dc is completed at each interval of R4, and (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc) is at each of 4 corners of R4)
- R6: (Please use the pink yarns) [3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch, (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, 2 ch)] x 4 times [72 sts] (Note: Each 3 dc is completed at each interval of R4, and (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc) is at each of 4 corners of R5)



R7: (Please use the purple yarns) (29 dc, 2 ch) x 4 times [116 sts] (Fig. 7-9)
 R8: Make 124 sc at each outermost knot (Fig. 10-11) Now you have finished 1x square piece. Repeat the above steps to make 12x square pieces (Note: You can choose any colour combination you like).



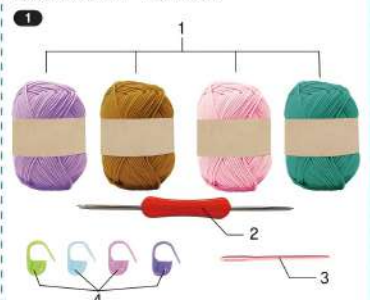
- #### 2. Connect all square pieces
1. Take 2 of the squares and line the edges up.
 2. Use the plastic needle and some extra thread to sew the pieces together. Pull the thread in between the loops of each square to connect. (Fig 12)
 3. Knot the thread at the end and cut. Hide the excess within one of the loops.
 4. Continue with the rest of the squares to finish the scarf!

WHAT'S IN THE BOX

- 1. Crochet yarn x 4
- 2. Crochet hook x 1
- 3. Plastic needle x 1
- 4. Ring stitch marker x 4
