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DIY Crochet Scarf Craft Kit Instruction Manual

Kit Includes

- 9 x 12ply acrylic yarn colours
- 1 x crochet hook
- 1 x plastic needle
- 1 x instruction sheet

Tips

- Find many great video tutorials online for stitches and methods.
- Create a loose weave by not pulling the stitches too tightly.

Basic Crochet Stitch Diagram

Slip Knot

All crochet projects start with the slip knot which is most commonly used. Create a loop about 15cm into your yarn. Insert your hook into the loop and pull the end attached to the yarn ball through the loop, then pull it tight. You now have a slip knot on your hook. Now it's ready to start your crochet.



Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain. The first step is to create a slip knot on your hook. The second step is to move your hook under your yarn to create a yarn over. The third step is to move the hook back through the loop already on your hook, making sure to catch the working yarn. You have now made your first chain. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make more chains. Hold the stitches you've already made in your left hand close to the hook for stability.

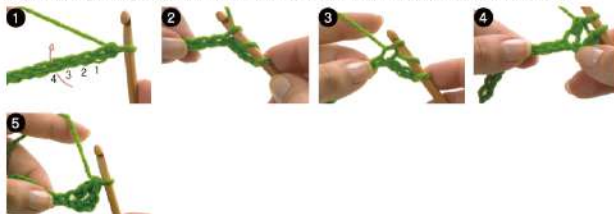

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Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'tr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus 2. Find the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over and insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over, then draw up a loop, there should now be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over, then draw the yarn through 2 of the loops on your hook. There should now be 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over and then draw the yarn through the 2 loops left on the hook. You have completed the stitch and should now have 1 loop on your hook.



Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Once you've made your last stitch, you'll have one loop left on your hook. Cut the yarn leaving a tail approx 15cm long. Wrap the yarn round the hook and pull through the loop. Remove the hook and pull the yarn tail to tighten it up. This will create a little knot so your yarn can't unravel.



Stitches name

- ch chain
- tr treble crochet
- F/O fasten off

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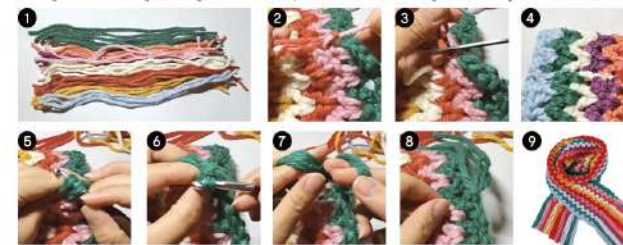
How To Crochet A Scarf

R1 slip knot, 18ch (start with the 4th stitch) (tr, ch, tr) x 61 times, tr (184 sts), after every group of 1 tr, ch, tr, skip 2 stitches and crochet with the 3rd stitch. R2-R10 3ch, (tr, ch, tr) x 61 times, tr (184 sts), change to another coloured yarn before beginning each row. R11 (change to another coloured yarn) (tr, ch, tr) x 61 times, tr (184 sts), F/O



How To Add Tassels

Cut 2 x 30cm lengths of yarn as a group. Cut a total of total 22 groups (4 x groups of cream and green yarn, 2 x groups of each remaining colour). At each end of this sort, tie two knots on the two adjacent yarns, then cut off the excess yarns. Use 1 group of coloured yarn that matches the crochet row colour and insert the crochet hook through the front of the scarf and pull the yarn through. Bring the crochet hook back through the same hole, leaving a loop of yarn on the back side. Remove the crochet hook and thread the 2 loose ends of yarn through the loop, ensuring both ends of yarn are the same length. Pull to tighten the knot. To complete the scarf, add the remaining tassels, matching the crochet row colour.



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
