INSTRUCTIONS

2 both bomb moulds 1 unicorn figure 3 scents
1 baking soda packet
3 coloured powders 1 citric acid packet 1 sheet of gift wrop

PREPARATION

Make sure your work area is clean and tidy and cover with paper towels. Wash hands before you begin. If any powder gets on your work surface wipe into your hand with a dry paper towel first then wash with soap and warm water. Gather all of the contents and keep them neatly in your workspace.

Single Colour Bath Bomb

What you need: baking soda, CITRIC ACID, bowl*, coloured powder, scents, water*, measuring spoons*, stirring stirk*

- 1. Use a bowl (at least 20oz/568mL in size) and add 40g baking soda to 20g citric acid
- 2. Add a teaspoon of coloured powder in the colour you want your bath bomb.

 3. Add 15 drops of your chosen scents. Gradually, add a few drops of oil until the mixture is the consistency of damp sand.

NOTE: You will need to blend the oil and the mixture together with your fingers to remove any clumps.

4. Fill the mould 1/3 with the mixture and place the unicorn figurine into the mould. Place the mixture into the mould, little by little and gently pat the mixture into the mould completely, adding more and more and pressing in with your finger until you cannot fill it anymore.

TIP: Pack each side of the mould, add a little extra on top. Note: The mixture will dry out fast so work quickly!

For best results, leave the bath bomb to set in the fridge for a few hours. To remove the bath bomb from the mould, gently pull apart the two mould sections and apply a little pressure to the back of the mould to

release the bath bomb. Let it dry out completely on a flat surface.

7. Drop your bath bomb into a warm bath and watch it pop and fizz. After first bath bomb is used another bath bomb can be made with the rest of the ingredients - up to a total of 3 bath bombs!







Multi-coloured bath bomb

What you need: baking soda, CITRIC ACID, 2 bowls*, coloured powder, scents, water*, measuring spoons*, stirring stick*

- 1. To create a two coloured bath bomb you will need two bowls to keep the mixtures separate
- Follow steps 1 2 in the Single Colour Bath Bomb project, using only half of the ingredients for each bowl. Make sure you have mixed the dry ingredients in both bowls before you start to mix in the wet
- 3. Now follow steps 3 4 in the Single Colour Bath Bomb project for both mixtures
- 4. Fill your mould partially with the colour mixture you wish to start with, then add a layer of your second colour. Continue layering your colours until your mould is filled to the edge.
- 5. For best results, leave the bath bomb to set in the fridge for a few hours. To remove the bath bomb from the mould, gently pull apart the two mould sections and apply a little pressure to the back of the mould to release the bath bomb. Let it dry out completely on a flat surface.
- 6. Drop your bath bomb into a warm bath and watch it pop and fizz.

Gift your bath bomb

What you need: bath bomb, gift wrap, twist tie*, tag*

- Follow the steps on one of the bath bomb projects to create a present for someone special.

 2. Put the giff wrap onto a flat surface and place the bath bomb into the centre of the gift wrap.

 3. Pull the sides of the wrap over the bath bomb to create a point above it. Pinch the wrap so your hand is resting on top of the bath bomb and use a twist tie to close the wrap.
