

MAKE SCARS & WOUNDS

You will need: greaseproof paper, a pack of clay, red 3D Paint, and pretend maggots.
Additional equipment: a tissue, red food colour, sticky dots & spatula.

1. Lay out your greaseproof paper sheet.
2. Open up your clay and rip off a very small amount.
3. Roll a small amount out with the palm of your hand to the shape of a sausage approx 3 cm long and 0.5cm wide.
4. Flatten the sausage with your finger slightly.
5. Now with the spatula, cut a line into the centre of the clay being careful not to cut straight through.
6. Take your red 3D Paint pen and fill the scab with a small amount of the glue.
7. Make your scab extra horrible by drizzling an amount of the red 3D Paint onto it. Leave to dry overnight.
8. Once the scab is set, place a few sticky dots on the flattened side and place on your arm or hand.
9. Now place some red food colour into a small container and add some water and mix.
10. Drop onto a clean tissue that you have cut to approx 2cm square and delicately push it over the scab making a small hole in the top so it rests against your skin.
11. Your painful scab is now complete.
12. Now to add the pretend maggots, take them out of the packet and with a little red 3D Paint, stick them to either side of the scab. You now have an awful maggot infected wound.

ZOMBIE VOMIT

You will need: Cornflour, water.
Additional equipment: a wooden spoon and a bowl.

1. Pour some of the cornflour into a bowl. Then gradually pour water over and mix until it looks and feels like custard.
2. Run your fingers through the liquid. Now try and punch the mixture with your fist.

What's happening? When you run your fingers through it, it acts like a liquid. But when you punch it, it becomes hard and behaves like a solid. (If it doesn't, try adding some more cornflour.)
How and why? The cornflour particles are suspended in the water, so it flows like a liquid. But when you apply force to it, the particles lock together, acting like a solid. As soon as the force stops, the slime goes back to being runny.

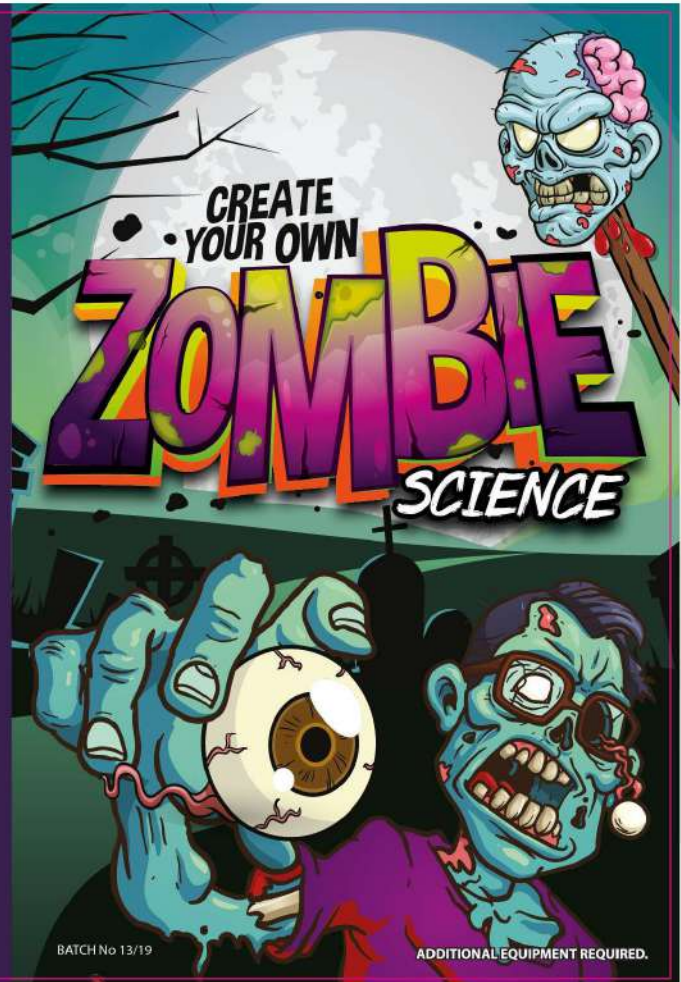
FLESH EATING MAGGOTS

You will need: Pretend Maggots, 3D blood and glow solution

1. Drop the pretend maggots into some glow solution for a few minutes then take out and allow to dry.
2. Squeeze out a small amount of 3D red glue.
3. Using your tweezers, carefully place a pretend maggot on top of the 3D blood and allow to dry.
4. Once the blood has set, take the pretend maggot and place it on your zombie head.

INTRODUCTION

This pack and its contents are designed to introduce your child to a world of science and wonderful discoveries. Always follow the instruction booklet carefully and have it on hand throughout each experiment. Have fun learning!

MOULD A ZOMBIE HEAD

SHAPE TO ACTIVATE THE GLOW LIQUID

You will need: Zombie head mould, clay, red 3D Paint, needle, glow solution, slime and paint brush.

1. Begin moulding your Zombie head by pressing the clay onto the moulds shaped surface. Use a small amount at a time, and make a smooth even surface on the inside of the mould.
2. Once you have covered the whole mould on the inside, turn the mould over.
3. Use the opposite end of the brush provided and prick holes into where the eyes and mouth would be.
4. Let it air dry overnight
5. Roll out some pink clay into 2 balls approximately 4cm in diameter.
6. Get a pencil (not included) and gently push it into the ball. Be careful not to push it all the way through the clay, you are trying to create a well.
7. Once you have hollowed out a well, take out the pencil and gather the top opening so that you are left with a smaller opening.
8. Leave the two balls to set overnight.
9. Once your balls are dry you can fill them with some slime.
10. Take your needle and dip it into the slime. Pull the needle plug back and draw out a full needle of slime.
11. Take your balls and inject them with slime.
12. You are now ready to decorate your head.
13. Take the filled balls and hold upright.
14. Take some of the glow solution provided and carefully paint the outside of the balls.
15. Carefully take the zombie head out of the mould and paint the inside of the mould with the glow solution provided.
16. Carefully fix the balls directly behind the eye sockets using some tape (not included).
17. Turn the head upright and you are ready to decorate it.
18. Drop some 3D red glue at the base of the nose, around the eye sockets and at the side of the mouth and using your brush add some glow in the dark details.

19. Remember, to make your zombie really stand out you can paint the mould using standard paints (not included).
20. Make some pretend maggots and glue them onto the head using the red 3D Paint provided.
21. Once you have finished the head, give the mould a squeeze and watch in horror as slime runs out of the zombie face, Gross!

MOULD AN EYEBALL

You will need: Eyeball mould, bag of crystals, 2 black beads, red 3D Paint and greaseproof paper.

1. Put the black bead into one side of the special eye mould provided.
2. Snap the other half of the mould into position, so that the black bead rolls around inside the sealed mould.
3. Stand the mould up so that the funnel moulding is pointing upwards.
4. Pour a small amount of the crystals into the mould and let it settle.
5. Now pour in the white crystals so that the crystals lie just beneath the top of the funnel.
6. Push down the crystals gently with the spatula so they compact themselves. Add a few more crystals if needed.
7. Fill your mixing cup with water and drop your eye mould into the cup.
8. Wait for approx 3 mins and then remove the mould from the water.
9. Unclasp the eye mould at the side to reveal your mad eyeballs.
10. Now to add realism, take your red 3D Paint and squeeze out random lines on the greaseproof paper provided.
11. Allow the glue to set.
12. The glue will dry raised, vein like.
13. With your red 3D Paint pen, dot the individual veins and attach to the back of the eyeball.
14. Add a few drops of red glue around the back of the eyeball.
15. To finish your eyeball, take a small amount of your green slime provided and drop around the base of your eye.

GLOWING ZOMBIE FLESH

You will need: zombie body mould, clay, paint brush, glow solution.

1. Press the clay into the zombie body mould. Make sure that the clay covers all the contours of the mould evenly.
2. Leave the clay in the mould overnight to dry.
3. Once the clay is set, tap the back of the mould gently on a hard surface and the clay zombie should easily lift out of the mould.
4. Use the brush and the glow solution to paint the zombie. You could also use the 3D Paint for extra detail.
5. Remember you can paint your zombie using paints (not included) when it has dried fully.
