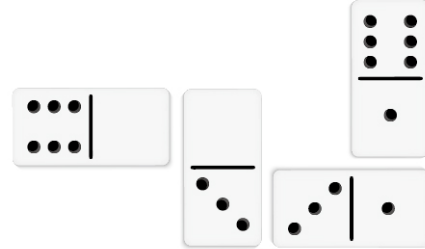

DOMINOES



BEFORE YOU GET STARTED:

Draw Dominoes is the simplest and most widely games. This standard domino game is typically played with two to four players and uses a standard set of 28 dominoes. Players draw dominoes and take turns forming a line of matching values. Draw Dominoes is easy to set up and entertaining for all ages.

HOW TO PLAY:

- Shuffle all the dominoes and lay them facedown in a pile at the end of the table. This is the "boneyard" from which to draw. Leave the middle of the table empty so there is enough room to play the game.
- Draw seven dominoes each from the "boneyard" for a two-player game, or draw five dominoes each if there are three to four players.
- Set your dominoes with the dots facing you.
- Determine the player with the highest double, or the highest value domino. This player goes first, then play passes to the left.
- Place the highest double domino on the table to start the game.
- Match the value from one of your dominoes with one side of domino on the table. Place the matching dominoes end to end, making sure they are touching. For example, if the first player put down a double four, the second player must play a tile with a four on one side.

A player with no playable domino picks from the boneyard until drawing one that can be played. Unplayable dominoes that are drawn become part of the player's hand. If a player has no play and there are no dominoes left in the boneyard, play passes to the next player.

- Continue playing around the table in a clockwise direction. Finish the hand when one player runs out of dominoes, or when no more dominoes can be played.

TIPS:

A double is a tile that has two of the same values on it.
Blanks match other blanks.

WINNING THE GAME:

Play continues until one player has used all of their dominoes or until no one can play. If no further plays can be made and all the dominoes have been drawn, the player with no dominoes or with the least number of points (dots on their remaining dominoes) wins the round.

The winner (or the winning pair) scores the total of the spots in their opponents' hand(s). Then shuffle and begin a new round. The player who won the previous round plays first. At the end of the third round, whoever has the highest score wins the game.
