USER MANUAL

DIVING MASK

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet the needs and requirements for diving use. Please read below instruction carefully prior to first use, and keep the instruction for references and/ or maintenance.

Instruction of correct use of mask

- For perfect water tightness, choose a mask that fits to your face.
- Press mask on your face without tightening the strap.
- Inhale with your nose until the mask has slightly suctioned to the face.
- If the mask has remained with the suction on your face for a few seconds without air leaking, the mask is correctly fitted.

WARNING

- Under no circumstances should anyone dive or swim alone.
- Mask and snorkel should only be used by individuals who are capable of swimming.
- This equipment can break or shatter when subjected to undue force or impact.
- NEVER JUMP OR DIVE INTO WATER WITH A MASK OR SNORKEL ON.
- This is a sports product and not a toy. If used by a youth, they must be supervised by an adult.

Care & Maintenance

- This mask should be used exclusively in water.
- Avoid violent impacts to the mask.
- Check that your equipment operates correctly before each use.
- Do not modify your mask by replacing or removing components yourself.
- Rinse with fresh water after use and store in a shadow, cool & dry place.
- Never use detergents or alcohol etc as cleaning agents.
- Avoid contact with chemical substance (alcohol, sun-tan lotions, oils & greases products...) etc.
- Do not place the mask to sources of heat or expose to direct sunlight.
- Always rinse after use with cool and clean water. Do not clean with harsh chemical cleaners.
- Store in a cool dry place and keep away from sunlight.

DIVING SNORKEL

The snorkel always has to fitted out of the water for breathing. Inhalation is impossible if the tip of the snorkel is under water. The snorkel fills with water as the result of splashing or when diving, through which swallowing water can come about. You should always inhale slowly and exhale powerfully to avoid swallowing water. Water penetrating into the snorkel tube can be removed by "blowing out". Please read below instruction carefully prior to first use, and keep the instructions for references and/or maintenance.

There are two type of snorkel: Class A and Class B:

Class A snorkel is for people with a large lung capacity.

Class B snorkel is for persons with a small lung capacity.

Class A: 43169078 (Adult snorkel set) & 43169283 (1UP snorkel set) is for people with large lung capacity.

Class B: 43169016 (Youth snorkel set) & 43168965 (Junior snorkel set) is for people with a small lung capacity.

Care & Maintenance

- This snorkel should be used exclusively in water.
- Check that your equipment operates correctly before each use.
- The fluorescent color on top of the tube makes the diver more visible when surfacing and must therefore be replaced if lost or discolored.
- Rinse with fresh water after use and store in a shadow, cool & dry place. Never use detergents or alcohol etc as cleaning agents.
- Avoid contact with chemical substance (alcohol, sun-tan lotions, oils & greases products...) etc.

Instruction for correct use of snorkel

- The tube must be correctly fixed to the mouthpiece and that the snorkel is firmly attached to the mask strap. Do not modify your snorkel by replacing or removing components yourself.
- The size of a snorkel is studied to adapt to the user.
- The flange of the snorkel is designed to fit between the inside of the lips and the teeth. Do not chew on the mouthpiece.
- Water will enter your snorkel from time to time when you dive.

This is normal and you must practice by blowing sharply to get rid of the water from the purge valve.


