

DIY Latch Hook Wall Hanging

Guide Image

Kit Includes

- > 1 x printed mesh backer
- > 4 x coloured yarns
- > 1 x latch hook
- > 1 x wooden rod
- > 1 x macrame cord
- > 1 x instruction sheet

Tips

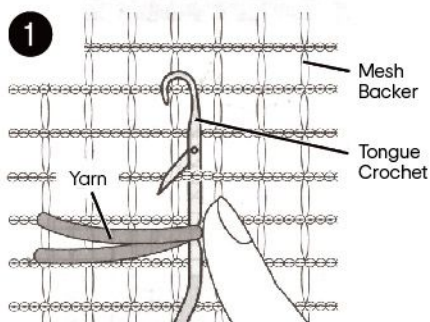
- Precut yarns (8cm) included for the main body.
- Always start making your first knot at the bottom, working your way up.
- The latch tool knots the yarn and secures it in place with one movement. This is simply repeated for every hole in the mesh.



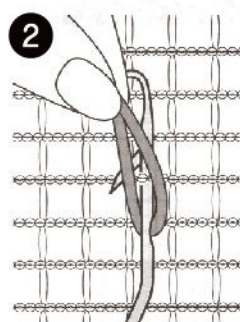
Cut The Yarn

- > 30cm x 32pcs white
- > 16cm x 32pcs white

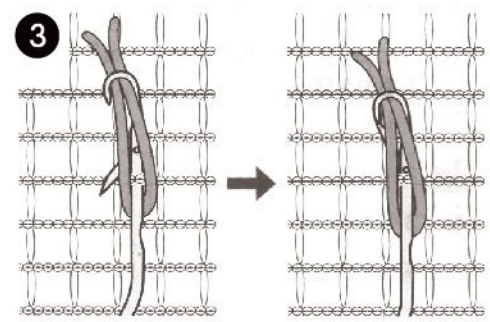
How To Make A Latch Hook Knot



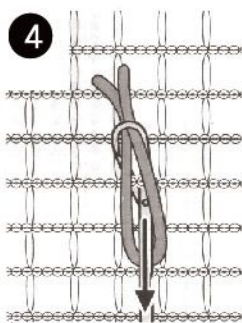
Fold a pre cut yarn in half and place it in the groove of the latch tool. Then insert the top of the latch tool through a hole in the mesh.



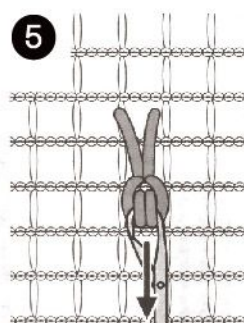
Next, hook the yarn around the latch tool.



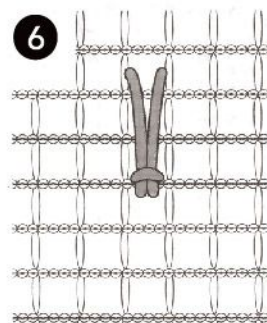
Place the yarn between the hook and the tongue while pulling the needle down a little.



Continue to pull the needle down slowly.

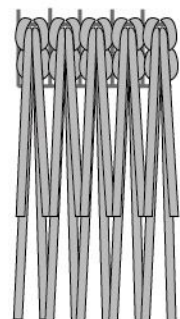


The yarn will pull through the hole to the back side of the mesh.



Pull the yarn gently to tighten the knot, then adjust the length and shape. Match the yarn colours to the printed pattern and repeat steps 1-5 to fill the mesh, leaving the bottom 2 rows for the fringing.

How To Make The Fringing



Using the longer 30cm cut yarns, repeat steps 1-6, adding a row of tassels along the bottom row. Then take the 16cm cut yarns and make a second row of tassels, 1 row above. Trim the ends to complete

How To Attach The Wooden Rod



Thread the yarn through the top row of mesh and wrap it around the rod. Continue to join the whole rod across the top of the mesh. To finish, attach a length of yarn to each end of the rod to hang your finished piece.
