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DIY Crochet Coasters Kit Instruction Manual

Kit Includes
 > 6 x crochet yarn colours
 > 1 x crochet hook
 > 1 x plastic needle
 > 1 x instruction sheet

Tips

- > Find many great video tutorials online for stitches and methods.
- > Create a loose weave by not pulling the stitches too tightly.
- > When you want to change yarn colour, work the last stitch until you have 2 loops left on your hook, where you can introduce the new colour. Fold the new yarn, leave around 4 inches of tail and draw it through the 2 loops on the hook to complete the stitch.

Basic Crochet Stitch Diagram

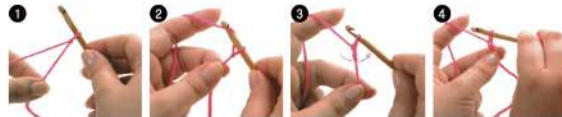
Slip Knot

All crochet projects start with the slip knot which is most commonly used. Create a loop about 15cm into your yarn. Insert your hook into the loop and pull the end attached to the yarn ball through the loop, then pull it tight. You now have a slip knot on your hook. Now it's ready to start your crochet.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

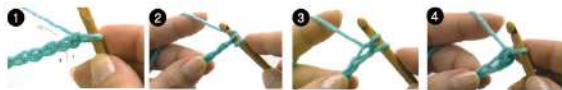
The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain. The first step is to create a slip knot on your hook. The second step is to move your hook under your yarn to create a yarn over. The third step is to move the hook back through the loop already on your hook, making sure to catch the working yarn. You have now made your first chain. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make more chains. Hold the stitches you've already made in your left hand close to the hook for stability.



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Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'dc')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. If you want to make a piece exactly 20 stitches wide, chain 21. Identify the 2nd chain from your hook and then insert your hook here. Yarn over, then draw up a loop; you will now have 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over and then draw the yarn through both loops on the hook so you have 1 loop on your hook. You have completed the stitch.



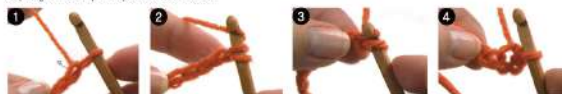
Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'tr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus 2. Find the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over and insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over, then draw up a loop; there should now be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over, then draw the yarn through 2 of the loops on your hook. There should now be 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over and then draw the yarn through the 2 loops left on the hook. You have completed the stitch and should now have 1 loop on your hook.



Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st' or 'ss')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus an extra 1. Identify the 2nd chain from your hook. Insert your hook into the 2nd chain from the hook and yarn over. Pull your hook back through the chain; there should be 2 loops on your hook. Holding the edge to yarn over, continue to pull the yarn through the 2nd loop on the hook - you have completed the stitch and should have 1 loop on your hook. Repeat steps 2-4 to finish the row.



4. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Once you've made your last stitch, you'll have one loop left on your hook. Cut the yarn leaving a tail approx 15cm long. Wrap the yarn round the hook and pull through the loop. Remove one hook and pull the yarn tail to tighten it up. This will create a little lock so your yarn can't unravel.

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How To Make Crochet Coasters (Strawberry, Cherry And White Flower)

Before Row 1 slip knot, 26ch [26 sts]
 Row1 (start with the 2nd stitch) 27dc [27 sts]
 Row2-Row26, 27dc [27 sts]
 Row27, 27ss [27 sts], F/O
 For the border:
 R1 (change yarn colour) [15ch, skip 5 or 6 stitches, sl] x 5 times [10 sts]
 R2 (slr, sl) x 20 times [140 sts], F/O (tips: crochet 6tr in each skip part and sl at the same place with the previous one).
 Hide excess yarn into stitches.
 Below pictures of steps just show the process of making white flower crochet coaster. Strawberry and cherry coasters with the same steps but see the patterns reference on page 4.



How To Make A Crochet Coaster (Purple Flower)

Before Row 1 slip knot, 25ch [25 sts]
 Row1 (start with the 2nd stitch) 26dc [26 sts]
 Row2-Row26, 26dc [26 sts]
 Row27, 26dc [26 sts], F/O
 For the border:
 R1 (change yarn colour) [15ch, skip 5 or 6 stitches, sl] x 5 times [10 sts]
 R2 (slr, sl) x 20 times [140 sts], F/O (tips: crochet 6tr in each skip part and sl at the same place with the previous one).
 Hide excess yarn into stitches.
