


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DIY Jewellery Kit Instruction Manual



- Kit Includes**
- 12 x bags of glass seed beads
 - 1 x bag of gold beads
 - 2 x pairs of earring hooks
 - 1 x needle
 - 1 x jewellery thread
 - 1 x clear card
 - 1 x instruction sheet

How To Make A Beaded Earring

Small Earring

1 Prepare 85 beads (49 flesh colour, 28 purple and 8 dark orange), 1 earring hook, 1 needle and jewellery thread. Knot a bead to your jewellery thread and take up 8 additional beads with your needle.

2 Add 2 beads and go back through bead #8 and #9 in the 1st row as shown.

3 Go back through bead #10 and #11 just added in the 2nd row. Pull the jewellery thread tight.

4 Repeat steps 2-3 to add the remaining 7 beads for the 2nd row. Then add the last 3 beads.

5 Flip your bead work over. Repeat steps 2-4 and finish the next 7 rows. Before you start to add beads to a new row, flip it over first. See pic 1 on page 4 for bead pattern reference.

6 Take the needle with jewellery thread and go through 4 beads on the 1st row of left side. Leave a small tail and tie a knot.

7 Add 4 beads and go through the 6th bead in the 1st row from left side. Cut the excess jewellery thread, leave a small tail and tie a knot. Hide the excess jewellery threads in the beads.

Add the earring hook and the beaded earring is complete. Make a second earring using the same method to complete a pair of earrings.

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Large Earring

1 Prepare 155 beads (71 light pink, 63 purple and 21 orange), 1 earring hook, 1 needle and jewellery thread. Knot a bead to your jewellery thread and take up 3 additional beads with your needle. Leave a small tail.

2 Stitch back through the first 2 beads so that you form a closed circle.

3 Go back through bead #3 and #4. Pull the jewellery thread tight.

4 Add 2 more beads and loop through bead #3 and #4. You will come out at the top.

5 Add another 2 beads. This time your thread will be at the bottom of the row.

6 Continue adding 2 beads at a time until you have 7 groups of 2 beads. The 1st row is complete.

7 For the 2nd row, add 4 beads and go through next thread from back to front.

8 Go back through the beads as shown.

9 Go through bead #6 and #3 to join the 4-beads together.

10 Add 2 beads and go through the next thread from back to front. Then go back through the added beads.

11 Repeat step 10 and continue adding 2 beads at a time until there are 6 groups of 2 beads in the 2nd row.

12 Flip your bead work over. Repeat steps 7-10 and finish next 4 rows. Before you start to add beads to a new row, flip it over first. The number of groups in each row is less than the number of groups in the previous row. See pic 2 on page 4 for pattern reference.

13 When 5 rows are complete, go through beads as shown to make both sides flared. Take the small tail and tie a knot.

14 To begin the beaded tassels, go through the beads as shown and knot the last bead, then go back through the beads to row 1. Repeat this step and keep adding beaded tassels. See pic 2 on page 4 for pattern reference. Once one tassel is complete, go through beads to top and tie a knot. Hide the jewellery thread and cut off any excess.

15 Add the earring hook and the beaded earring is complete. Make a second earring using the same method to complete a pair of earrings.

How To Make A Beaded Bracelet

1 Thread beads onto the clear cord in your desired pattern. Measure the length to fit your wrist and keep adding beads until you reach your desired length.

2 After threading beads, make a knot with both cord ends as shown. Cut the excess cord and leave small tails. Hide the small tails in the beads.

3 The beaded bracelet is complete. Repeat steps 1-2 to make more bracelets with your design.
