

# DIY Polymer Clay Accessories Kit Instruction Manual

## Kit Includes

- > 14 x polymer clay colours
- > 2 x gold keyrings
- > 2 x tassels
- > 18 x jump rings
- > 2 x silver beads
- > 4 x earring hooks
- > 4 x earring studs with backers
- > 2 x clay tools
- > 1 x clear cord
- > 1 x roller
- > 1 x stencil
- > 1 x instruction sheet

## Tips

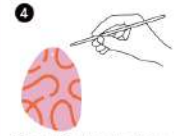
- > Wash your hands before beginning and lay down a clean, smooth work surface.
- > Baking time can vary depending on the oven and clay thickness. Take care to avoid burning the clay.
- > Use a protective mitt or similar to remove the tray from the oven and do not handle the hot clay. Leave the clay to cool and harden on the tray.
- > Add holes in clay pieces before baking.
- > Each pair of earrings require 2 matching shapes.

## How To Shape Polymer Clay Earrings

**1** Use the roller to roll out a clay slab to around 5mm thickness. Ensure the slab is large enough to cut out at least two matching shapes.

**2** Add small pieces of coloured clay to create your desired pattern. Use the roller to press them firmly into the base layer and flatten the slab to around 3-4mm thick.

**3** Press the stencil into the clay to cut the earring shapes using the clay tool. Smooth the edges with the tool and your fingers. Each pair of earrings needs two pieces of the chosen shape.



Make holes for the hooks and rings with the pointed end of the clay tool. Ensure the hole is close to the edge to fit the ring. Make a variety of shapes and colours with the remaining clay and stencils.

## How To Bake Polymer Clay Earrings



Preheat the oven to 120°Celsius. Place clay on a tray lined with baking paper. Bake for 15 minutes. Baking time may vary depending on clay thickness. Carefully remove from the oven and allow to cool before touching.

## How To Make Polymer Clay Earrings



To add the earring hooks, open the jump rings and join your desired earring shapes.

## How To Make A Polymer Clay Keyring

**1** Place 6g yellow clay, 10g blue clay, 8g pink clay, 10g yellow clay, 8g green clay and mould into balls.

**2** To make pattern beads, follow the guides below:

Marbled bead: Use 6g white clay and 2g blue clay and blend it together until a marbled pattern forms.

Dot bead: Mould 8g of purple clay into a ball, then poke holes in the surface using the clay tool.

Spotty bead: Mould 10g white clay into a ball. Make mini balls using black clay and press them into the surface.

Confetti bead: Mould 10g white clay into a ball. Make mini strips using black clay and press them into the surface.



Place the centre of the clay ball with the wooden stick, making a hole all the way through to create a bead.



Preheat the oven to 140°Celsius for 10 minutes. Place the balls on an oven tray lined with baking paper. Bake for 15 minutes. Baking time may vary depending on the clay thickness and oven. Carefully remove from the oven using an oven mitt and allow to cool before touching.



Thread the keyring onto the cord and secure it with a knot. Add your desired beads and a tassel at the end.



The keyrings are complete and ready for use.
